

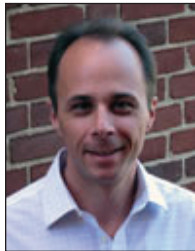

**Dr. Wragg** has been involved with curricular evolution and change in both main campus and regional campus environments. In her role of assistant dean, her experience has been in the areas of teaching, curriculum planning, in-house faculty and community faculty development, administration and infrastructure design of the program.
